Dear Planning Partners:

The Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) and Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act established a series of performance measures to ensure effective use of Federal transportation funds. Title 23 Part 490 of the Code of Federal Regulations (23 CFR 490) Subpart B establishes five performance measures for the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP):

- 1) Number of fatalities
- 2) Rate of fatalities
- 3) Number of serious injuries
- 4) Rate of serious injuries
- 5) Number of non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries.

The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT), in cooperation with our partners, is required to establish targets for each of the five Safety Performance Measures annually by August 31. PennDOT has established the annual targets in Appendix 1 of the enclosure, effective August 31, 2018. The targets reflect the <u>2017</u> <u>Strategic Highway Safety Plan</u> (SHSP) goal of reducing fatalities and serious injuries by 2%.

Federal regulations require Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) to establish targets for each performance measure, within 180 days of PennDOT establishing targets (by February 27, 2019) either by agreeing to plan and program projects in support of PennDOT targets, or by committing to their own quantifiable targets. PennDOT is requesting that Rural Planning Organizations (RPOs) also establish targets by February 27, 2019, by agreeing to support the PennDOT targets or setting their own.

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) will determine annually whether PennDOT has met, or has made significant progress toward meeting established statewide targets. More information on Transportation Performance Management (TPM) is available at <u>https://www.fhwa.dot.gov/tpm/</u>.
